Cattle numbers on feed remain steady

The September quarter ALFA/ MLA survey has indicated that while cattle numbers on feed were 17% higher than the same period last year, they remain steady compared to the previous quarter as difficult market conditions persist.

Australian Lot Feeders' Association (ALFA) President Jim Cudmore stated that "cattle numbers on feed remained at 743,000 head with the benefit of modest declines in feeder cattle and grain prices offset by the rising Australian dollar and continuing sluggish demand in export markets".

"While turnoff increased by 8% over the quarter, the increase in cattle numbers in Queensland and Victoria was countered by a decline in Western Australia".

"Feeder cattle prices averaged 3% lower than the corresponding quarter last year as a result of decreased competition from re-stockers and processors, along with increased supply in NSW and Queensland as continuing dry conditions forced cattle onto the market".

"Feed grain prices were on average 26% lower than this time last year as a strong northern hemisphere harvest improved global grain stocks while the predicted 18% increase in Australia's winter crop and strong Australian dollar also applied downward pressure".

Meat & Livestock Australia's Chief Economist, Peter Weeks stated that "grain fed beef exports remained steady compared to the same period last year, with the bullish Australian dollar and increased US competition stifling the sector's recovery from the global financial crisis".

"Compared to the same period last year, Australian grain fed beef exports rose 1% into Japan but declined 5% into Korea".

"Trading conditions into these key markets also became tougher as the quarter progressed with the Australian dollar increasing by 6% against both the Japanese yen and Korean won".

Mr Cudmore continued, "Whilst the grain fed beef sector remains upbeat, the sectors prosperity will be determined by a number of interrelated but uncertain variables".

"The on-going global financial crisis, interest rates, Australian dollar along with the size of the summer crop will be closely monitored by the industry over the next 6 to 12 months, Mr Cudmore concluded".

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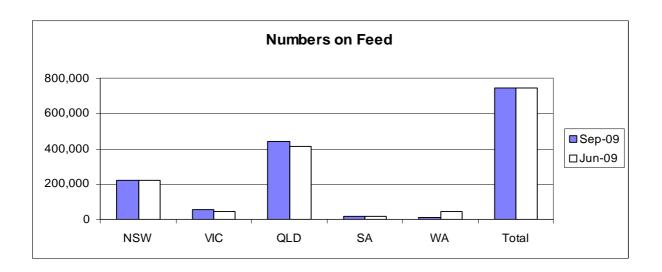

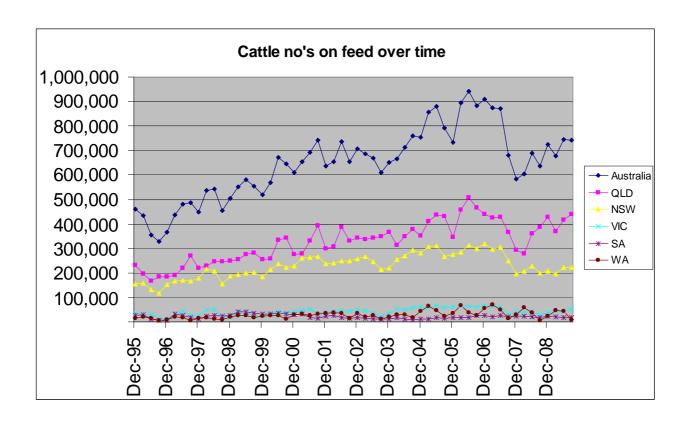

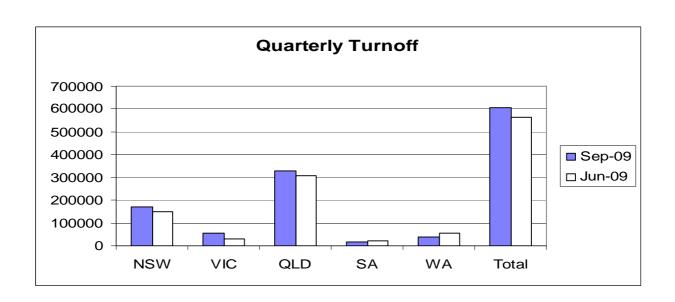
